(RIS) Coordination align to all Communities initiatives, with a primary focus on People, Place and Home. RIS Coordination works in partnership with Communities Officers (officers) across Western Australia to provide consultation and coordination for individuals with complex disability related support needs and families, in exceptionally difficult and critical situations, facilitating connection to appropriate services using a values-based approach to facilitate good outcomes.

RIS Coordination has direct interface with other Government Departments (State and Commonwealth), service providers and local communities to be solution focused, educate, develop and increase capacity.

- Disability specific access criteria to be met
- RIS Coordination manager sign off on all referrals
- Being flexible to accommodate requests from Communities colleagues
